

Woman airlifted after red-light camera crash

VICTORVILLE • A woman was airlifted after slamming into a vehicle that came to a sudden stop at an intersection monitored by red-light camera.

The three-vehicle collision happened around 1 p.m. Wednesday at Bear Valley Road and Seventh Avenue, according to San Bernardino County Sheriff's Victorville station officials.

The three vehicles were traveling west on Bear Valley Road when the first car came to a sudden stop at the yellow light to avoid running a red light, Deputy Jeff Wetmore said. A second vehicle was able to stop before striking the first, but the driver of a minivan could not and slammed into the back of the second vehicle. The intersection has a red-light camera.

The female driver of the third vehicle was airlifted to Arrowhead Regional Medical Center in Colton, officials said. The extent of her injuries is unknown.

Investigators had to refer to the red-light video to confirm the stories of the motorists.

Both drivers of the second and third vehicles have suspended licenses, according to officials.
